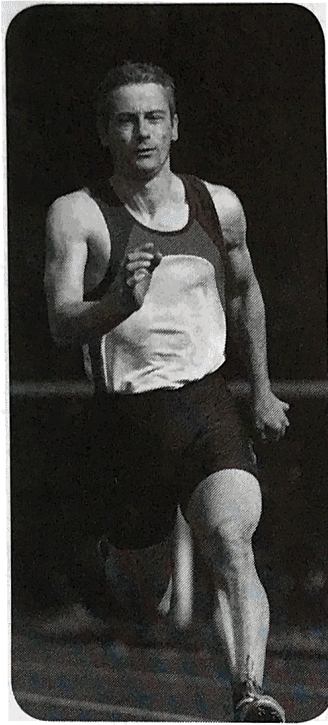


Good Friday Service: Christians Together, 11.00 am–12 noon at the Bandstand, foot of King Street.
